Dear Platt College Students,

On June 15th California ended many of the public health requirements that have been in place since the pandemic began. **The Staff and Faculty at Platt College look forward to welcoming all students back to in-person learning on campus starting September 13, 2021!** June and August modules will remain in a remote learning environment with the exception of select classes being scheduled on campus. Remote learning will no longer be an available option after the summer modules.

We will continue to follow all guidance issued by federal, state, and local agencies to ensure a safe learning environment. Please take these next few months to prepare to return to campus. Platt College strongly encourages our students, faculty, and staff to receive the COVID-19 vaccine to minimize the risk of infectious disease. At this time, Platt College is not requiring students to be vaccinated to return to campus.

What to expect when returning to campus:

- All areas of the campus will continue to be cleaned as required by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), and local health departments.
- Symptom screening procedures will continue to be conducted each day when arriving to campus.
- Masks are required to be worn by non-fully vaccinated individuals.
- Masks are optional for vaccinated individuals.

In general, people are considered fully vaccinated:

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.

If you don't meet these requirements, regardless of your age, you are NOT fully vaccinated.

Recommendations to reduce your risk of exposure and spreading COVID-19:

- Get a COVID-19 vaccination
- Wear a mask over your nose and mouth.
- Social distance when possible. Limit close face-to-face contact and avoid congregating before, between and after classes.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If not available. Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
